Japanese judoka Hifumi Abe won his second consecutive Olympic gold medal in the men's 66-kilogram category Sunday in Paris, hours after his younger sister Uta fell to a shock second-round loss.

Hifumi defeated Brazil's Willian Lima by ippon in the final at the Champ-de-Mars Arena to restore family pride that was dented after the Abe siblings' bid to win gold medals on the same day, as they did at the pandemic-hit Tokyo Olympics in 2021, was dashed.

"This is an unforgettable memory for me," Hifumi said. "My sister lost today, and it was a very difficult day, but I worked hard with the feeling that I had to ( 27 ) to make up for it."

"I felt I had no choice but to ( ) as the older brother. I was able to keep my 27emotions in check," he said.

During the morning session, Uta lost to <u>IJF</u> top-ranked judoka and eventual gold medal winner Diyora Keldiyorova of Uzbekistan by ippon in the women's 52-kilogram second round.

Hifumi's win gave his country its ( 28 ) judo gold of the Paris Games, following Natsumi Tsunoda's triumph in the women's 48-kilogram category the previous day.

In the semifinals, Hifumi beat IJF top-ranked Denis Vieru of Moldova with a waza-ari sweeping hip throw in golden score before tossing down Lima with a sleeve-lifting hip throw in the final.

## Commitment to Peace (August 6, 2024)

Close your eyes and imagine: a beautiful city of <u>verdant</u> green, a shopping street full of people, smiling faces across the town. Hiroshima 79 years ago was filled with people living colorful day-to-day lives, much like today.

At 8:15 am on August 6, 1945, there was a great, eardrum-splitting <u>roar</u> and a <u>vermillion</u> cloud <u>tinged with</u> black rose into the sky. People and plants alike were blackened in the blaze and the city was drowned in cries for help and tears of despair. In the words of one hibakusha, Hiroshima on that day was ( 31 ) on earth. The atomic bomb stole the color from their lives and turned Hiroshima into a world of ash gray.

My great grandmother was a hibakusha, but she never spoke of that day. Sorrowful memories, too painful to put into words, still continue to 32) torment many of the hibakusha today, 79 years later.

Even now, wars continue to plague the planet. Around the world, those who didn't want to die are dying, and people are losing loved ones who were supposed to be there with them day after day, much (33) as it was 79 years ago. Is there really no other way?

( 34 ) will not come from prayers alone. It is up to us to protect our colorful day-to-day lives and build ( 34 ).

Listening carefully to others, viewing differences as a good thing and reconsidering your perspective, cooperating with friends to accomplish a goal: these are all steps that each of us can take toward peace.

Now is the time for us to learn about and experience Hiroshima together. Visit the Peace Memorial Museum, listen to the words of the hibakusha, and discuss the preciousness of peace and the importance of life with ( 35 ).

Here, we take one step forward to world-changing peace.
